The KING has been pleased, by Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual bearing date the 13th instant, to direct the issue of a Commission under the Seal appointed by the Treaty of Union to be kept and made use of in place of the Great Seal of Scotland granting the Office of His Majesty's Advocate for Scotland to John Wheatley, Esquire, K.C.

At Edinburgh, on Monday the thirteenth day of October nineteen hundred and forty-seven years, Mr. John Wheatley, K.C., took the Oath of Allegiance and the Official Oath on his appointment as Lord Advocate in the presence of The Right Honourable Thomas Mackay Cooper, The Lord Justice-General, in the forms set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. OATH OF ALLEGIANCE.

I, John Wheatley, K.C., do swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to His Majesty, King George Sixth, His Heirs and Successors, according to law, so help me God.

2. OFFICIAL OATH.

I, John Wheatley, K.C., do swear that I will well and truly serve His Majesty, King George Sixth, in the Office of Lord Advocate, so help me God.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 17th October 1947, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £170,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 20th October 1947 to Saturday the 25th October 1947 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
