NORTH OF SCOTLAND HYDRO-ELECTRIC BOARD.
CONSTRUCTIONAL SCHEME No. 15.
GAUR PROJECT.

THE Electricity Commissioners have approved a Constructional Scheme prepared by the North of Scotland Hydro-Electric Board in accordance with Section 5 of the Hydro-Electric Development (Scotland) Act, 1943, providing for the construction of Works the situations of which are shown in Part I. of the Schedule hereto, and for the acquisition of the lands and wayleaves specified in Part II. of the said Schedule.

The Scheme has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Scotland for confirmation.

Copies of the Scheme are available for inspection and sale (2s. 6d. per copy, post free) at the offices of the Board and at the offices of the County Clerk of Perth and Kinross, Perth; the Highland District Clerk, Pitlochry; the Town Clerk of Perth, Perth; the Town Clerk of Aberfeldy, Aberfeldy; the Town Clerk of Pitlochry, Pitlochry; and of Messrs. Sherwood & Company, St. Stephen's House, Victoria Embankment, Westminster, London, S.W.1.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.—WORKS.

IN THE PARISH OF FORTINGALL IN THE COUNTY OF PERTH.

Work No. 1.—A reservoir (being an enlargement of Loch Eigheach) to be formed by constructing three dams at points 800 yards or thereby in a north-westerly direction, 430 yards or thereby in a westerly direction, and 900 yards or thereby in a south-westerly direction respectively, from the bridge carrying the public road from Kinlochranoch to Rannoch Station over the Allt Chaldar and including a fish pass between the tail race of the generating station (Work No. 3) and this reservoir.

Work No. 2.—An aqueduct line or lines of pipes commencing at or in Work No. 1 and terminating at Work No. 3.

Work No. 3.—A generating station situated at the termination of Work No. 2 at a point 220 yards or thereby in a southerly direction from the said bridge over the Allt Chaldar, including a tail race to the River Gaur.

Work No. 4.—An aqueduct line or lines of pipes commencing at a point on the Allt Chaldar and terminating at or in Work No. 1.

Work No. 5.—An aqueduct line or lines of pipes commencing at or in Work No. 1 and terminating on the Abhainn Duibhe.

Work No. 6.—An aqueduct formed in the bed of the River Gaur.

Work No. 7.—A diversion of the public road which runs from Kinlochranoch to Rannoch Station.

PART II.—LANDS AND WAYLEAVES.

Lands surrounding Loch Eigheach and on both banks of the River Gaur, in the Parish of Fortingall, together with other land in the said Parish, all in the County of Perth.
