A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS by the Emergency Powers Act, 1920, it is enacted that if it appears to Us that any action has been taken or is immediately threatened by any persons or body of persons of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be calculated, by interfering with the supply and distribution of food, water, light, or with the means of locomotion, to deprive the community or any substantial portion of the community, of the essentials of life, We may, by Proclamation, declare that a state of emergency exists :
And whereas the cessation of work in certain sections of the dock industry does, in Our opinion, constitute a state of emergency within the meaning of the said Act :

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby declare that a state of emergency exists.

Given at Our Court at Holyroodhouse, this twenty-eighth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, and in the twelfth year of Our reign.

DESIGNATION ORDER UNDER SECTION 1.

NEW TOWN (GLENROTHES) DESIGNATION ORDER, 1948.

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Scotland, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Section 1 of, and the First Schedule to, the New Towns Act, 1946, as applied to Scotland by Section 25 of that Act, made on the thirtieth day of June 1948, an Order designating as the site of a proposed new town an area of land extending to 5730 acres or thereby in the Parishes of Markinch, Leslie, and Kinglassie, and County of Fife, and shown within the inner edge of the red shaded line on the Map referred to in the Order.

This area is the area which was shown on the Map annexed to the Draft New Town (Glenrothes) Designation Order, 1948, which was deposited for inspection at Preston School, Markinch, on the 12th day of January 1948, and with respect to objections to which a Public Local Inquiry was held in the County Buildings, Kirkcaldy, on the 31st day of March 1948.
