## A PROCLAMATION.

## GEORGE R.

WHEREAS by the Emergency Powers Act, 1920, it is enacted that if it appears to Us that any action has been taken or is immediately threatened by any persons or body of persons of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be calculated, by interfering with the supply and distribution of food, water, light, or with the means of locomotion, to deprive the community or any substantial portion of the community, of the essentials of life, We may, by Proclamation, declare that a state of emergency exists :
And whereas the cessation of work in certain sections of the dock industry does, in Our opinion, constitute a state of emergency within the meaning of the said Act :
Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby declare that a state of emergency exists.

Given at Our Court at Holyroodhouse, this twenty-eighth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, and in the twelfth year of Our reign.

## DIPLOMATIC PRIVILEGES (EXTENSION) ACT, 1944.

In pursuance of Subsection 3 (c) of Section 1 of the Diplomatic Privileges (Extension) Act, 1944 (7 \& 8 Geo. 6, Ch. 44), His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs hereby gives notice of the following amendments of the lists published in the Edinburgh Gazettes of April 24th, 1945, and of March 1st, 1946, of the persons on whom immunities and privileges have been conferred by the Diplomatic Privileges (U.N.I.O., the Refugees Committee, and E.A.C.) Order in Council, 1945, the said amendments taking effect as from April 22nd, 1948.

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## EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875.
