At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 29th day of March 1949.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of March 1949 (N.11513/48), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

"And whereas by Your Order in Council dated 9th May 1945, provision was made *inter alia* for allowances to be payable as a war measure for the dependants other than the wives of Seamen, Marines, and Reservists serving in the Royal Navy and Royal Marines :

"And whereas we are of opinion that a system of National Service Grants should be instituted with effect from 1st January 1949, under which grants may be issued in certain circumstances to men called up for National Service and joining for duty on or after 1st January 1947, to assist them to provide for their dependants during their called up service; such Grants not to exceed a maximum of £3 a week for any one such National Service man, and payment to be subject to the man contributing an allotted portion of his pay for the support of his dependants :

"And whereas dependants allowances, special dependants allowances, war service grants, and emergency grants, which were payable as a war measure should be terminated on 31st December 1948, subject to such payments as were then in issue being transferred to National Service Grants and being administered under the same conditions as are applied to such Grants :

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty, by Your Order in Council, may be graciously pleased to give your sanction accordingly :

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 8th April 1949, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £170,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 11th April 1949 to Saturday the 16th April 1949, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

SUPPLEMENTARY RECONSTRUCTION COMPETITION FOR THE GENERAL SERVICE AND DEPARTMENTAL CLASSES OF MECHANICAL AND ELECTRICAL ENGINEERS.

1. Men and Women may compete under these Regulations except that women will not be eligible for appointment in the Air Ministry or for the Royal Mint.

2. Age. (i) General Service candidates must be at least 25 and under 44 years of age on 1st August 1949, and they must have been born on or after 2nd August 1905, and on or before 1st August 1924.

(ii) Candidates for the Departmental competitions must be at least 23 years of age on the 1st August 1949, i.e. they must have been born on or before 1st August 1926. For the Ministry of Civil Aviation candidates must be under 39 years of age on 1st August 1949, i.e. they must have been born on or after 2nd August 1910, and for the Ministry of Supply they must be under 38 years of age on 1st August 1949, i.e. they must have been born on or after 2nd August 1911.

3. Nationality. Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions :—

(a) if natural-born British subjects they must either
(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment;

(b) if naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment;

(c) if not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

Provided that a candidate will not be eligible for an appointment under the Air Ministry or the Ministry of Supply unless he or she is a natural born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self governing Dominions of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case, provided the candidate satisfies the conditions prescribed by the preceding paragraphs, he or she may be admitted to appointment by competition by special permission of the Secretary of State for Air, or the Minister of Supply, as the case may be.

4. Qualifications. I. General Service Class competition.

(i) The minimum qualifications must include either

(a) Corporate membership of one of the following: the Institution of Civil Engineers, the Institution of Mechanical Engineers, the Institution of Electrical Engineers; or

(b) A University Engineering degree, or other examination passes required by any of the above institutions for exemption from sections A and B of their examination for Associate Membership, provided that the Commission may at their discretion admit candidates who can furnish evidence of exceptionally high professional attainment.

Candidates who are taking the necessary examinations before 1st August 1949, will be admitted provided that appointments will be made only if the examination qualifications are obtained during 1949.

Candidates qualified under (b) above will be recruited subject to their securing the qualification under (a) above before completion of probationary service.

(ii) In addition all candidates must produce evidence that both the examination subjects included in their qualification (see (i) (a) and (b) above) and their practical experience are appropriate to the particular requirements specified below.

Air Ministry. Candidates should :—

1. (a) be holders of a university degree in electrical and or mechanical engineering, and have served at least two years apprenticeship; or

(b) be graduates of the Institution of Electrical Engineers, or hold an equivalent diploma in electrical engineering, and have served at least three years apprenticeship; or

(c) be graduates of the Institution of Mechanical Engineers, or hold an equivalent diploma in mechanical engineering with appreciably electrical engineering experience and have served at least a three year apprenticeship.

II. Have been employed for a minimum of two years with a well established engineering concern of sufficient size and scope for them to have gained experience in both mechanical and electrical engineering.

Royal Mint. Candidates will be required to possess a university degree in Mechanical Engineering, preferably of honours standard and to have had at least two years of practical experience, towards which some experience of metallurgical practice would be desirable.

Ministry of Transport. Candidates for mechanical posts should, in addition to holding one of the qualifications referred to above, have completed a recognized course of theoretical and technical training in mechanical and automobile engineering and have experience of road vehicle design and construction. For electrical posts candidates should be experienced in the preparation of specifications and in investigating the performance of equipment. In addition a knowledge of testing in relation to electrical work is required.

Ministry of Works. Candidates will be required to furnish evidence of their apprenticeship and experience. 8. *Competition.* (i) Candidates who have previously competed in the Temporary (Reconstruction) competitions and who failed to obtain an appointment, are not debarred from making application for entry to the Supplementary competition.
