A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS by the Emergency Powers Act, 1920, it is enacted that if it appears to Us that any action has been taken or is immediately threatened by any persons or body of persons of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be calculated by interfering with the supply and distribution of food, water, fuel, or light, or with the means of locomotion, to deprive the community, or any substantial portion of the community, of the essentials of life, We may, by proclamation, declare that a state of emergency exists:

And whereas the stoppage of work on an extensive scale in the Port of London does, in Our opinion, constitute a state of emergency within the meaning of the said Act:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby declare that a state of emergency exists.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this eleventh day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-nine and in the thirteenth year of Our Reign.

GOD SAVE THE KING.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:

RECRUITMENT UNDER NORMAL REGULATIONS TO THE SITUATION OF OFFICER OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE (MALE).

1. No candidate may compete more than twice in all under Normal Regulations and under Reconstruction Regulations for the situation of Officer of Customs and Excise.

2. Age. Candidates must be at least 19 and under 21 years of age on the 1st September 1949. But—

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age;

(b) a candidate who has served voluntarily in H.M. Forces otherwise than on a regular engagement, or who has performed or is performing compulsory National Ser-

vice under the National Service Acts, may deduct the period of such service from his actual age, up to a maximum of two years;

c candidates who have served in any established post to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they have spent in such service before 1st September 1949.

3 *Sex and Marriage.* Men only are eligible.

4 *Nationality.* Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

a If natural-born British subjects, they must either—
i have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or,

ii have resided in His Majesty's dominions and or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment;

b If naturalized British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment;

c If not qualified under a) or b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour

5. *Health and Character.* Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

6. *Examination.* The subjects of examination will be as follows:—

The Interview, Subject 7, will be held at a later date than the examination in the remaining subjects. Of the candidates who obtain the highest aggregate marks in Subjects 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, a certain number to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners will be summoned to the Interview. The final list of candidates eligible for appointment will be made up by uniting the results of the two parts of the examination. Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

7 *Candidates Trained as Teachers.* Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority e.g. the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland has been notified to the Commissioners.

8. *Fee.* A fee of 10s is payable by all candidates. This must be sent with the application form and is not returnable in any circumstances.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an open competitive examination will be held under the above Regulations commencing on the 13th December 1949 to fill approximately 200 vacancies.

The written examination will be held at various centres.
