The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 17th day of October 1949 (C.W. 3524/49), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-second day of January 1920, Schedule B, the titles of certain Warrant Officers and Officers promoted from Warrant rank were revised :

“And whereas from time to time certain other alterations to Warrant Officer titles have been provided for by various subsequent Orders in Council :

“And whereas we are of the opinion that the title ‘Warrant Officer’ and the term ‘Warrant List’ in use in the Royal Navy and Royal Marines should no longer be used but be replaced by ‘Branch Officer’ and ‘Branch List’ respectively :

“And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-seventh of April 1948 rates of pay were laid down for Warrant Officers and Officers promoted therefrom which we now wish to apply to Officers on the Branch List :

“And whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable

in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the proposals contained in the Schedule annexed hereto with effect from the 5th day of April 1949 in substitution for the provisions previously authorised, which changes involve the appointment by commission of those Warrant Officers hitherto appointed by warrant but otherwise no change in rates of pay, uniform, or duties.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

“SCHEDULE.

“TITLES OF WARRANT OFFICERS AND OFFICERS PROMOTED FROM WARRANT RANK.

“The term ‘Warrant List’ to be abolished and to be known in future as the ‘Branch List’; the general title for officers on this list to be ‘British Officers.’ All officers on the Branch List to be appointed by commission. Their rates of pay to be as laid down for corresponding Warrant Officers (Naval and Royal Marine) and officers promoted therefrom in Order in Council dated 27th April 1948.

And whereas His Majesty deems it expedient to make further provision concerning retired pay, pensions and other grants in cases where the disablement or death of members of the naval forces is due to service after the 2nd September 1939:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Him thereunto enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Order in Council dated the 29th September 1949, relating to members of the naval forces as therein defined, shall be amended in the respects set out in the following Articles of this Order.

1. Article 22 of the Order in Council dated the 29th September 1949 (which provides for the award in certain cases of allowances for part-time treatment) shall be amended by substituting for the figures 21s. and 30s. the figures 25s. and 35s. respectively.

2. This Order shall be construed as one with the Order in Council dated the 29th September 1949, and shall come into operation on the 1st November 1949.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Him thereunto enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Order in Council dated the 29th September 1949 relating to officers, nurses, and ratings as therein defined, shall be amended in the respects set out in the following Articles of this Order in Council.

1. Article 10 of the Order in Council dated the 29th September 1949 shall be amended by substituting for the figures 21s. and 30s. the figures 25s. and 35s. respectively.

2. Paragraph (3) of Article 22 of the Order in Council dated the 29th September 1949 shall be deleted and there shall be substituted therefor the following paragraph:—

" (3) (a) In the Table in the Second Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order for the figures £168 in column (3), £168 in column (4), and £126 in column (5), there shall be substituted the figures £170, £180, and £170 respectively; and for the figures £140, £120, £120, and £90 in columns (2), (3), (4), and (5) there shall be substituted—

(i) against the reference in column (1) to a Lieutenant, R.N. and Lieutenant, R.M. with over 4 years' commissioned service, the figures £165, £150, £165, and £150 respectively; and

(ii) against the reference in column (1) to a Sub-Lieutenant, R.N., Lieutenant, R.M. with less than 4 years' commissioned service, Second Lieutenant, R.M. and Quartermaster, R.M., the figures £150, £130, £150, and £130 respectively.

(b) In the Table in the Third Schedule to the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, for the figures £105 and £90 in column (2) and £90 and £75 in column (3) there shall be

substituted the figures £150, £125, £130, and £105 respectively."

3.—(1) This Order shall be construed as one with the Order in Council dated 29th September 1949 and, subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of this Article shall come into operation on the 1st November 1949.

(2) Article 2 of this Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st June 1949.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

1. This Order amends the Order of the 29th September 1949 concerning pensions and other grants for disablement and death due to naval service during the 1914 World War.

2. Article 1 provides for an increase in the allowances for part-time treatment.

3. Article 2 provides for an increase in the rates of the pensions payable to certain widows of officers to the rates payable to comparable widows of officers whose deaths occurred as the result of service after the 2nd September 1939.
