

TRANSPORT ACT, 1947.

NOTICE is hereby given that the British Transport Commission, with the consent of the Minister of Transport, pursuant to Paragraph 7 of a Scheme of Delegation to the London Transport Executive made by them on the 5th December 1947 and approved by the said Minister on the 11th December 1947, have issued an Instrument (No. LT/EX/2) delegating to that Executive all the rights, powers, and liabilities in respect of the Whitechapel and Bow Railway, the Hammersmith and City Railway, the East London Railway, the electrified railways between White City Station and Ealing Broadway Station, the electrified railways between North Acton Junction and Northolt Junction, the electrified railways between Northolt Junction and West Ruislip, the Kensington and Richmond Railway between Acton Lane East Junction and Studland Road Junction, the railways between East Finchley Station and High Barnet Station and between Finchley Central and Mill Hill East Stations, the railway between Leyton Junction and Ongar, the railway between Woodford Junction and Newbury Park Station, and the railway forming part of the London Transport Executive's Central Line through Stratford Station (subject to certain exceptions specified in the Instrument), which vested in the Commission by virtue of the transfer to them under Part II of the above Act of the undertakings of the Whitechapel and Bow Railway Company, the Great Western Railway Company, the London Passenger Transport Board, the London and North Eastern Railway Company, the Southern Railway Company, and the Great Western and Great Central Railways Joint Committee and applying to such delegation the provisions of Paragraphs 4 and 5 of the said Scheme.

1. High Voltage Lines.

Three-phase overhead lines in the County of Inverness designed for operation at 132,000 volts between phases with one line of towers from the transforming station to be known as "Fasnakyle Transforming Station" (erected under the provisions of the Board's Constructional Scheme No. 14), in the Parish of Kilmorack, to Fort Augustus, in the Parish of Boleskine.

2. Transforming Station.

In connection with the aforesaid overhead lines a

transforming station to be provided near Fort Augustus, in the said Parish of Boleskine and County of Inverness.
