TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 26th May 1950, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £240,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Tuesday the 30th May 1950 to Saturday the 3rd June 1950 inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post, on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

NATIONAL INSURANCE ADVISORY COMMITTEE. NOTICE OF SUBMISSION OF QUESTION BY THE MINISTER OF NATIONAL INSURANCE.

REVIEW OF PROVISIONS IN RELATION TO MATERNITY.

Under Section 41 of the National Insurance Act, 1946, the Minister of National Insurance has asked the National Insurance Advisory Committee

"(1) to consider the operation of the present provisions of the National Insurance Act, 1946, and Regulations made thereunder, in relation to maternity, and

"(2) to advise what changes (if any) should be made in those provisions so as to secure that, without adding to the present liability of the National Insurance Fund in respect of maternity, the money available shall be used to the best advantage in helping to meet the monetary needs of women in connection with maternity."

The Committee will be glad to take into consideration representations from organisations and persons concerned with this question. Representations should be made in writing in the first place and should be sent to the Secretary to the National Insurance Advisory Committee, 30 Euston Square, London, N.W.1, before 31st August 1950.

MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT. TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under Section 1 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, the effect of which will be :—

- (a) that a diversion of a length of the Glasgow-Greenock-Monkton Trunk Road which he proposes to construct at Kilwinning in the County of Ayr will become a trunk road on the date when the Order comes into operation ;
- (b) to provide for the construction by the Minister of a bridge carrying the diversion over the navigable waters of the River Garnock ;
- (c) that the length of the Glasgow-Greenock-Monkton Trunk Road which will be superseded by the diversion will cease to be a trunk road on the sixteenth day of May next after the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Ayrshire County Council (who will thereafter become the highway authority responsible for that length of road) that the diversion is opened for through traffic.

Copies of the draft Order and the Plan showing the line of the diversion and the length of the Glasgow-Greenock-Monkton Trunk Road to be superseded thereby and of the Bridge plan may be inspected by any person free of charge at all reasonable hours during a period from 19th May 1950 to 18th August 1950 at the Ministry of Transport, Berkeley Square House, London, W.1, or at the offices of the Ayrshire County Council, County Buildings, Ayr, or at the offices of the Divisional Surveyor, Howgate, Kilwinning, or at the offices of the Divisional Road Engineer, 21 Castle Terrace, Edinburgh, 1.

Any person may within a period of three months from 19th May 1950 object to the making of the Order by notice
