EXTENSIONS OF SPECIAL DISTRICTS.

NOTICE is hereby given, in accordance with the terms of N Section 147 (2) of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1947, that the County Council of Dunbarton propose to alter, by extending (a) the boundaries of EASTERN SPECIAL DRAINAGE DISTRICT to take in an additional area in the Parish of Cumbernauld; (b) the boundaries of CUMBERNAULD SPECIAL LIGHTING DISTRICT to take in additional areas in the Parish of Cumbernauld; (c) the boundaries of GARELOCH SPECIAL SCAVENGING DISTRICT to take in areas at Whistlefield, Portincapie, Camsail, High Kilcreggan, Ardmay, and Morlaggan in the Parishes of Rhu, Rosneath, and Arrochar; (d) VALE OF LEVEN AND RENTON SPECIAL SCAVENGING DISTRICT to take in an area in the Parish of Luss; and (e) the boundaries of CUMBERNAULD SPECIAL SCAVENGING DISTRICT to take in additional areas in the Parish of Cumbernauld.
