NATIONAL INSURANCE ADVISORY COMMITTEE. NOTICE OF REFERENCE OF QUESTION BY THE MINISTER OF NATIONAL INSURANCE.

REVIEW OF SEASONAL WORKERS REGULATIONS.

Under Section 41 of the National Insurance Act, 1946, the Minister of National Insurance has asked the National Insurance Advisory Committee :—

“To review the experience gained during the first year's working of the National Insurance (Seasonal Workers) Regulations, 1950, and consider whether any amendment of the Regulations is desirable.”

The Committee will take into consideration representations from organizations and persons concerned. Representations should be made in writing, in the first place, and should be sent to The Secretary, National Insurance Advisory Committee, 30 Euston Square, London, N.W.1, before 12th October 1951.

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FOR SCOTLAND.
PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) (SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS, 1937 TO 1948.

The Secretary of State for Scotland gives notice, in pursuance of the above-named Regulations, that he hereby recognizes the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as showing (a) that the meat or meat product to which it relates was derived from animals inspected ante and post mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Secretary of State, and (b) that all necessary precautions for prevention of danger to public health were taken in the dressing or preparing and packing of the meat or meat product.

The Certificate being in the form of a label, recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or to the package containing the meat or meat product and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.

The label hereby recognized is in substitution for the label having on it the design reproduced in the Schedule to the Notice published in the Edinburgh Gazette of the 26th April 1949, which is hereby revoked.

THE GLASGOW CORPORATION (TRAMWAY
ABANDONMENT) ORDER, 1951.

WHEREAS the Corporation of the City of Glasgow (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation"), in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 5 of the Glasgow Corporation Order, 1934 (24 & 25 Geo. 5, c. lxi.), have provided and equipped trolley vehicles along the route of the tramway described in the Schedule to this Order, being part of Tramway No. 7, authorized by Section 5 of the Glasgow Corporation Act, 1893 (56 & 57 Vict., c. ccviii.), vested in the Corporation by Section 5 of the Glasgow Corporation (Tramways Consolidation) Order, 1905 (5 Edw. 7, c. cxxviii.), and forming part of Tramway No. 91, shortly described in Part I of the First Schedule to the last-mentioned Order;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Transport, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 19 of the said Order of 1934 and of all other powers him enabling in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. The Corporation are hereby authorized to abandon permanently the tramway described in the Schedule to this Order.

2. As from the date of this Order the powers and obligations of the Corporation to run a service of cars on the said tramway shall cease and as from the date on which the taking up and removal of the rails of the said tramway and the posts, poles, wires, cables, paving sets, and other works and apparatus provided in connection therewith (so far as the same shall not be adapted or used for the purpose of working trolley vehicles), and the restoration of the portion of the road or footpath disturbed by such taking up and removal shall have been duly completed all other powers, liabilities, duties, or obliga-

tions conferred or imposed upon the Corporation by any Act or Order relating to the said tramway shall cease.

3. The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict., c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

4. This Order may be cited as "The Glasgow Corporation (Tramway Abandonment) Order, 1951."
