NOTE.—The following diseases were eradicated from Great Britain in the years indicated :—Cattle plague or rinder-pest (*pestis bovina*), 1877 ; pleuro-pneumonia (*peripneumonia contagiosa bovum*), 1898 ; sheep pox (*variola ovium*), 1850 ; rabies, 1922 ; epizootic lymphangitis (*lymphangitis epizootica*), 1906 ; and glanders (including farcy) (*malleus*), 1928. Dourine (*exanthema coitale paralyticum*) has never existed in Great Britain.

PUBLIC PARKS BYE-LAWS.

WATER BYE-LAWS.

NOTICE is hereby given in terms of Part IV of the 1st Schedule to the Water (Scotland) Act, 1946, that on the expiry of one month from the date of this advertisement, the Provost, Magistrates, and Councillors of the Burgh of Denny and Dunipace, incorporated under the Local

Government (Scotland) Act, 1947, intend to apply to the Secretary of State for confirmation of Bye-laws (i) for preventing the waste, undue consumption, misuse or contamination of water supplied by them; (ii) prescribing the size, nature, design, materials, strength and workmanship, and mode of arrangement, connection, disconnection, alteration and repair of the water fittings to be used; and (iii) forbidding the use of any water fittings which are of such a nature or design or are so arranged or connected as to cause or permit, or be likely to cause or permit, waste, undue consumption, misuse, erroneous measurement, or contamination of water, or reverberation in pipes; the said Bye-laws, having been enacted at a meeting of the said Provost, Magistrates, and Councillors on the twelfth day of February 1952.

NOTICE OF REGISTRATION OF WHOLESALE
MERCHANTS REGULATIONS, 1952.

1. The White Fish Authority hereby give notice that, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the above Act, it is their intention to make Regulations which will come into operation on the 21st day of April 1952, and which will provide for, *inter alia* :—
