THE EARL MARSHAL'S REGULATIONS FOR THE HEAD COVERING TO BE WORN BY LADIES AT THE CORONATION OF HER MAJESTY QUEEN ELIZABETH II.

LADIES attending the Coronation wearing afternoon dress must wear a head covering. This must not cover the face but should be in the form of a veil falling from the crown or the back of the head as far as the shoulders but not lower than the waistline. Any colour excepting black can be used and should be made in a suitably light material such as tulle, chiffon, organza or lace, and may be attached by a comb, jewelled pins, flowers or ribbon bows, but not with feathers.

Ladies attending in evening dress may wear a tiara or a similar head covering to that laid down for Ladies in afternoon dress.

The Secretary of State for Scotland has been pleased under Orders dated 3rd December 1952 to approve the transfers, as from 1st January 1953, of Sheriff-Substitute Robert Ian Aonas MacInnes from Glasgow to Hamilton and of Sheriff-Substitute William James Bryden from Hamilton to Glasgow.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Section 9 (4) of the Finance Act, 1952, entitled the Purchase Tax (No. 8) Order, 1952.

This Order brings furniture within the scope of the "D" scheme established by Section nine of the Finance Act, 1952. It sets out in the Schedule the prescribed list of furniture eligible for "D relief." The figures appearing in the last column of the Schedule represent the amounts which are to be deducted from the wholesale value for purchase tax purposes of the goods to which they apply. Tax is accordingly chargeable at the appropriate rate on the value (if any) remaining after the deduction.

The Order automatically brings into operation that part of Section eight of the Finance Act, 1952, which abolishes the exemption from purchase tax of utility furniture and component parts thereof.
