The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Scotland has, in pursuance of the powers competent to him under the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855 (18 and 19 Vict., c. 68), made a Representation that he has received a copy of an Interlocutor, dated 2nd July 1953, pronounced by the Sheriff of Lanark, at Glasgow, finding that the Burial Ground known as the Old Portion of Leadhills Graveyard in the Parish of Crawford and the County of Lanark, is overcrowded and is in a condition which is offensive and contrary to decency:

And whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that, in terms of Section 5 of the said Act, burials be forthwith discontinued in the said Burial Ground subject to the exception hereinafter mentioned:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 12th day of September 1953, notice of such Representation was given and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 29th day of October 1953, and that the said Order or Notice thereof should be published in the *Edinburgh Gazette*, and that copies of the said Order or Notice should be fixed on the doors of the churches of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parish of Crawford one month before the said 29th day of October 1953:

And whereas Notice of the said Representation and of the time when it pleased Her Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council has been duly published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* and fixed in manner required by the said Order in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. That in terms of Section 5 of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, burials be forthwith discontinued in the Burial Ground at Leadhills in the Parish of Crawford and County of Lanark, known as the Old Portion of Leadhills Graveyard, except for the burial of cremated human remains.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Scotland) (Leadhills Graveyard) Order, 1953.
