REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF CARTOGRAPHIC DRAUGHTSMEN IN THE ADMIRALTY

1. Age.

Candidates must be at least 16 and under 25 years of age on 1st March 1954.

But for the purpose of this Regulation

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st March 1954;

(b) a candidate who has served in H.M. Forces otherwise than on a regular or short-service engagement may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st March 1954, up to a maximum of 2 years.

2. Sex.

Both men and women are eligible.

3. Nationality.

Candidates must be natural-born British subjects born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions. No departure from this rule will be made without the special permission of the First Lord of the Admiralty and then only in exceptional cases and in favour of candidates who are British subjects and who also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either (i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's Dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's Dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's Dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners to their health and character.

5. Examination.

The subjects of examination and the marks they will carry are as follows:—

Compulsory Subjects:

(1) English	100
(2) Mathematics	100

Candidates will be arranged in order of merit according to their total of marks in the examination as a whole. Even if there are unfilled vacancies, no candidate will be appointed who does not obtain a sufficient number of marks to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners in English, Mathematics, Drawing, Paper I, and in the examination as a whole. Candidates over the age of 21 on 1st March 1954, must also reach a satisfactory standard in Drawing, Paper II.

6. Candidates Trained as Teachers.

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

7. Fee.

An application fee of 7s. 6d. is payable by all candidates. This must be sent with the application form, and is not returnable in any circumstances. A further fee of 12s. 6d., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £1, must be paid by each candidate on admission to the examination.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF ASSISTANT PREVENTIVE OFFICERS IN THE WATERGUARD SERVICE OF THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE DEPARTMENT

1. No candidate may compete more than twice for the situation of Assistant Preventive Officer.

2. Age.

Candidates must be at least 19 and under 21 years of age on 1st March 1954.

But—

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st March 1954;
