QUEEN'S PALACE, DECEMBER 20, 1809.

This day Murza Abdul Hassan, Envoy Extraordinary from his Majesty the King of Persia, had his first private audience of his Majesty to deliver his letters of credence.

To which he was introduced by the Marquis Wellesley, his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Robert Chester, Esq. Assistant-Master of the Ceremonies.

The Persian Envoy Extraordinary was accompanied to his audience of his Majesty, by Sir Gore Ouseley, Bart. whom his Majesty has been pleased to appoint to hold the situation of Mehmander to the Envoy, during his residence at this Court.
