3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

The Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 1) Order, 1955.

This Order continues until 18th March 1956, the existing exemption from duty under the Import Duties Act, 1932, of the iron and steel goods specified in Part I of the Schedule to the Order. The Order also exempts until 18th September 1955, the iron and steel goods specified in Part II of the Schedule (some of which were previously exempted until 18th March 1955).

The Order comes into operation on the 14th January 1955, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1955, No. 33.
