NATIONAL INSURANCE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Notice of submission of Preliminary Draft Regulations entitled

National Insurance (Increase of Benefit and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations, 1955

IN accordance with Section 77 of the National Insurance Act, 1946, the National Insurance Advisory Committee give notice that they have received from the National Insurance Joint Authority (comprising the Minister of Pensions and National Insurance and the Minister of Labour and National Insurance for Northern Ireland) for consideration and report thereon the preliminary draft of regulations entitled the National Insurance (Increase of Benefit and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations, 1955.

A short explanatory note on these regulations is appended to this notice.

The Committee will take into consideration any objection, made by or on behalf of persons affected, sent to them before 11th February 1955. Having regard to the terms of the Act, which provides that objections must be made within a period of 28 days at most, the Committee are unable to allow a longer period within which objections may be submitted. If an objection is submitted within the prescribed time, however, the Committee will be prepared, if they are satisfied that sufficient grounds exist, to allow the later submission of evidence or explanation in support of the objection. Explanatory Note

These Regulations, which are made in consequence of the National Insurance Act, 1954, increase the rates of benefit payable under certain regulations made under the National Insurance Act, 1946, in order to bring them into conformity with the higher rates of benefit payable directly under that Act by virtue of the Act of 1954. Provision is also made to increase the amount of a maternity grant payable under regulations in certain cases, for altering the requirement as to weekly earnings in the case of a female person having the care of a child, for relaxing the earnings rule in the case of a widowed mother's allowance (where the rate thereof is less than the full weekly rate), with regard to the basis on which claims in respect of additional benefit arising under the Act of 1954 are dispensed with, and for the refund of contributions (in respect of weeks commencing on or after the 6th June 1955) to persons electing not to be qualified for retirement pension. Special provisions are made in relation to the payment of additional benefit in the case of persons not residing in Great Britain. The remaining provisions are of a minor or consequential character.

DISEASES OF ANIMAL ACT, 1950

NOTICE is hereby given in pursuance of Section 85 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Orders:—

Statutory Instruments 1954 No. 1745

The Live Poultry (Restrictions) (Amendment) Order, 1954

(Made 31st December 1954)

This Order which comes into operation on 17th January 1955, amends the Live Poultry (Restrictions) Order, 1954. The principal changes are:—

(1) The expression "store poultry" is now so defined as to exclude only those geese that are under the age of nine days (instead of twenty-eight days as formerly).

(2) The movement of poultry to a licensed market, fair or sale of poultry intended for immediate slaughter is prohibited unless and until each bird has been marked in a prescribed manner.

(3) The prohibition on the movement of poultry, day old chicks and hatching eggs into the Isles of Scilly from any other part of Great Britain has been withdrawn but the area comprising Wales and certain West Midland counties of England into which the movement of live poultry from the rest of Great Britain is prohibited has been extended to include the Isles of Scilly and certain south-western and northern counties of England.
