MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT AND CIVIL AVIATION TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946 SPECIAL ROADS ACT, 1949 WAUKMILL AND OTHER DIVERSIONS

THE Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under Section 1 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, as extended by Section 14 of the Special Roads Act, 1949, the effect of which is that three new roads which he proposes to construct near Waukmill in the County of Fife will become trunk roads on the date when the Order comes into operation and the lengths of the Dennyloanhead-Kinross-Kirkcaldy-St. Andrews Trunk Road to be superseded thereby will cease to be trunk roads on the sixteenth day of May next after the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Fife County Council (who will thereafter become the highway authority responsible for those roads) that the new roads are opened for through traffic.

Copies of the Order, the title of which is "The Dennyloanhead-Kinross-Kirkcaldy-St. Andrews Trunk Road (Waukmill and Other Diversions) Order, 1955," can be purchased, price 3d. either through any bookseller or direct from Her Majesty's Stationery Office at 13a Castle Street, Edinburgh, 2.

Copies of the Order and of the plan referred to therein have been deposited at the Ministry of Transport and Civil Aviation, Berkeley Square House, London, W.1, and at the offices of the Fife County Council, County Buildings, Cupar, Fife, and may be seen at all reasonable hours.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, as amended by the Special Roads Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, as so amended has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks of the twenty-eighth day of January 1955, apply to the Court of Session for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
