Civil Service Commission, 26th July 1955.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF CLERICAL ASSISTANTS IN THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE.

1. Age.

Candidates must be at least 15 and under 20 years of age on 1st October 1955.

2. Sex.

Women and girls only are eligible.

3. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

5. Examination.

The examination will consist of papers in English, Arithmetic, and General Knowledge, and a clerical test.

Separate competitions will be held for each city, and candidates for each city will be arranged in order of merit on their total mark in the examination. No candidate may compete for a vacancy in more than one city at the same time. Even if there are unfilled vacancies, no candidate will be appointed who does not obtain a total which satisfies the Civil Service Commissioners.

6. *Candidates trained as teachers.*

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

7. *Assignment.*

The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. A candidate who declines to accept the post offered will have no claim to be assigned to another, but will be regarded as having declined appointment. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service, but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account.

8. *Fee.*

A fee of 10s. must be paid by each successful candidate before a Certificate of Qualification can be issued.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competition will be held under the above Regulations, the written examination commencing on 7th October 1955.

No person will be admitted to the Competition from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before 11th August 1955, an application on the prescribed form which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

the boundaries of said Burgh, videlicet:—(a) that Area o Land marked Number 1 on the said Plan extending to 27.15 acres or thereby lying to the South of the said Burgh containing the playing fields of the Ross High School Tranent and part of the Lands and Farm of Easter Windy-goul; (b) the Area of ground marked Number 2 on the said Plan lying to the Southwest of the said Burgh extending to 22.9 acres or thereby containing private dwelling houses in Lammermoo Terrace and Birsley Road, Tranent, agricultural land and part of the Poison Public Park, Tranent; (c) the Area of ground marked Number 3 on the said Plan lying to the North West of the said Burgh extending to 46.68 acres or thereby containing agricultural land part of the lands and Farm of Bankton, private dwelling houses at Bank Park Crescent, Tranent and Market Garden Ground and Buildings and; (d) the Area of land marked Number 4 on the said Plan lying to the North East of the said Burgh extending to 35.82 acres or thereby containing Market Garden Ground and Buildings and agricultural land part of the lands and Farm of

Portobello Mains: (Second) that the following area of ground coloured yellow on the said Plan ought to be excluded from within the boundaries of said Burgh, videlicet:—the area of land marked Number 5 on the said Plan extending to 11.90 acres or thereby lying to the South West of the said Burgh part of the lands of the farm of the Meeting House; and (Third) that the proposed alterations are reasonable and ought to be given effect to; therefore Revises, Alters, Extends and Contracts the Boundaries of the Burgh of Tranent as craved in the prayer of the Petition and Finds and Declares that the foregoing alterations shall be deemed to have come into force on the sixteenth day of May, nineteen-hundred and fifty-five and that from and after the said sixteenth day of May, nineteen-hundred and fifty-five the boundaries of the said Burgh of Tranent shall be as follows, videlicet:—The Area, lands and heritages situated in the Parish of Tranent and County of East Lothian bounded by a line commencing at the point marked "A" on the Plan (No. 21 of process) docketted and signed as relative hereto, where the present Southern boundary of the Burgh meets and crosses the Public Highway designated as classified road B.6371 and known at this point as Ormiston Road, Tranent, then Southwards along the East side of the said highway for a distance of 200 yards or thereby to a point marked "B" on the said plan designated by a concrete post or pillar situated on the east side of the said highway then in a Westerly and then a North Westerly direction across the said Public Highway and along the Northmost side of the proposed new By-pass road or highway to be formed to the South of the said Burgh as approved by the Ministry of Transport and Civil Aviation by an Order dated the 21st day of September 1954 under reference Number RT1.170 0 4 and as delineated on the Development Plan of the County of East Lothian framed under and in terms of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1947, to a point marked "C" on the said plan situated on the South side of the road or street known as Lammermoor Terrace, Tranent where the said proposed new By-pass road or highway skirts the said road or street and which point is designated by a concrete post or pillar, then Northwards across the said Road or Street to the Southern extremity of the Stone wall forming the Western boundary of the Path or Lane known as the "Park Lane," Tranent, leading from the said road or street known as Lammermoor Terrace to the Public Highway designated Trunk Road A.1. and known as Edinburgh Road, Tranent, then Northwards along the said stone wall to the said Public Highway, then again Northwards across the said Highway and along the stone wall and hedges forming the West side of the lane or path known as the Roupin' Stairs, Tranent to the Northmost extremity of the said lane or path where it meets the Public Highway designated Classified Road B.1349 and known as Johnnie Cope's Road, then in a North Easterly direction to the Westmost extremity of the North side of the road known as the Brickworks Road, Tranent, then in an East-North-Easterly direction along the said North side of the said Brickworks Road to the point where the said road joins the lane or path known as the Dovecot Brae, Tranent, then still in an East-North-Easterly direction along the North side of the said lane or path known as the Dovecot Brae to the point where the said lane or path meets the Highway designated as Classified Road B.6371 and known at this point as the Meadowmill Road, Tranent, then South-South Eastwards crossing the said Meadowmill Road to the South side thereof then in a North-Easterly direction along the South side of the said Meadowmill Road to the Northmost extremity of the stone wall forming the Western boundary of the Tranent Cemetery then in a South-South-Easterly direction along the said stone wall forming the Western boundary of the said Cemetery to the Southern extremity thereof, then in an East-North-Easterly direction along the stone wall forming the Southern boundary of the said Cemetery to the Eastmost extremity thereof then across the railway line known as the Mineral Railway, Tranent to the East side thereof, then in a South-Easterly direction, then again in a South-South-Easterly direction then again in a South-South-Westerly direction crossing the said Public Highway designated Trunk Road A.1. and known at this point as Haddington Road, Tranent along the Eastmost side of the said Mineral Railway to a point marked "D" on the said Plan marking the point on the East side of said Mineral Railway opposite the Eastmost extremity of the Hawthorn hedge forming part of the boundary between the Windygoul Housing Scheme of the East Lothian County Council and the Ross Crescent Housing Scheme of the Petitioners which point "D" is situated 200 yards or thereby South-South-West of the South side of said Trunk Road A.1. known as Haddington Road aforesaid, measuring along the East side of said Mineral Railway, then in a North-Westerly direction crossing the said Mineral Railway along the said boundary between the said Housing Schemes to the North Westmost extremity thereof then in a South-Westerly direction along the stone wall forming the remainder of the boundary between the
