Civil Service Commission, 26th July 1955.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz. :--

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF CLERICAL ASSISTANTS IN THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE.

1. Age.

Candidates must be at least 15 and under 20 years of age on 1st October 1955.

2. Sex.

Women and girls only are eligible.

3. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the tollowing conditions:---

(a) If natural born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject ; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If natur ilised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or re idence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their for our favour.

4. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Com missioners as to their health and character.

5. Examination.

The examination will consist of papers in English, Arithmetic, and General Knowledge, and a clerical test. Separate competitions will be held for each city, and can-didates for each city will be arranged in order of merit on their total mark in the examination. No candidate may compete for a vacancy in more than one city at the same time. Even if there are unfilled vacancies, no candidate will be consisted who does not obtain a total which existing the test of the same be appointed who does not obtain a total which satisfies the Civil Service Commissioners.
