

5 *School Recommendation.*

Candidates must be recommended by the Headmaster or Headmistress of their school as suitable for appointment in the Civil Service.

6 *Interviews.*

The Commissioners will summon to appear before an Interview Board all who are found to be *prima facie* eligible. The Interview Board will recommend to the Civil Service Commissioners those candidates considered suitable for appointment. The Commissioners' decision will be final.

7 *Health and Character*

Candidates selected for appointment must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character before they can be appointed.

8 *Assignment.*

The Commissioners will, after consideration of any recommendations made by the Interview Board, decide to which Department in the Birmingham area each successful candidate is to be assigned. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service, but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account.

9 *Fee.*

A successful candidate must pay a fee of £1 before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment, provided that this fee will not be required from a candidate who has attended the written examination of September 1955, for the Clerical Classes and has paid the fee prescribed for that examination.
