**TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.**

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 19th August 1955, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £270,000,000.

**WAGES COUNCILS ACTS 1945 to 1948**

**RUBBER PROOFED GARMENT MAKING INDUSTRY  
COMMISSION OF INQUIRY.**

*Notice by the Commission of Inquiry appointed by the Minister of Labour and National Service to inquire into and report on a joint application made under Section 2 (1) of the Wages Councils Act, 1945 by the British Rainwear Manufacturers' Federation and the Waterproof Garment Workers' Trade Union for the establishment of a Wages Council for certain workers and their employers.*

The Minister of Labour and National Service (herein-

after referred to as "the Minister"), having appointed the Rubber Proofed Garment Making Industry Commission of Inquiry in accordance with the Second Schedule to the Wages Councils Act, 1945, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") has referred to it a joint application made to him by the British Rainwear Manufacturers' Federation and the Waterproof Garment Workers' Trade Union, under Section 2 of the Act, for the establishment of a Wages Council in respect of the workers specified in the Schedule to this Notice and their employers, on the ground that the existing machinery for the settlement of the remuneration and conditions of employment for the said workers is likely to cease to be adequate for that purpose.

Under Section 4 of the Act, it is the duty of the Commission to inquire into and report to the Minister on the said application, to consider, not only the subject matter of the reference but also any other question or matter which, in its opinion, is relevant thereto, and in particular to consider whether there are any other workers (being workers who, in its opinion, are engaged in work which is complementary, subsidiary, or closely allied to the work performed by the workers specified in the Schedule hereto, or any of them) whose position should be dealt with together with that of the workers, or some of the workers, specified in the Schedule hereto.

In considering whether any machinery is, or is likely to remain, adequate for regulating the remuneration and conditions of employment of any workers, the Commission is required by Section 4 of the Act to consider not only what matters are capable of being dealt with by that machinery, but also to what extent those matters are covered by agreements or awards arrived at or given thereunder, and to what extent the practice is, or is likely to be, in accordance with those agreements or awards.

Accordingly the Commission hereby give notice, pursuant to Section 9 of the Act, that it will consider representations with respect to the foregoing matters made to it in writing at the offices of the Commission at Ebury Bridge House, Ebury Bridge Road, London, S.W.1, on or before the 30th day of September 1955.

Workers employed in the manufacture of

- (1) garments from textiles processed with rubber, rubber substitute, or plastic, and headgear from such textiles when manufactured in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such garments;
- (2) garments from any material in which the processes of smearing, sticking, or cementing with a solution of rubber or rubber substitute either by hand or machine, are involved;

including workers employed

- (a) on the altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of the garments or headgear mentioned above;

- (i) engaged in the manufacture of garments or headgear from chemically proofed or oil proofed fabrics or from plastic film;
- (ii) in relation to whom any wages council constituted under the Wages Councils Act, 1945 operates.

THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz:—

**REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF ASSISTANT PREVENTIVE OFFICERS IN THE WATERGUARD SERVICE OF THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE DEPARTMENT.**

1. No Candidate may compete more than twice under these Regulations for the post of Assistant Preventive Officer.

2. Age.

Candidates must be at least 19 and under 21 years of age on 1st September, 1955. But—

- (a) a candidate who has served or is serving in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st September, 1955.

(b) a candidate who has served in any established post to which he was admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from his actual age any time not exceeding two years which he has spent in such service before 1st September, 1955.

3. Sex.

Men only are eligible.

4. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

5. Education.

No precise educational qualifications are prescribed, but candidates will be expected to have attained the standard of education of persons who have had whole-time systematic education up to the age of at least 16 years.

6. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

7. Examination.

(a) Written examination

(b) Interview . . . . . 250

(i) The interview will be held after the written examination. Of the candidates who obtain the highest aggregate marks in the written examination a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, will be summoned to interview. The final order of merit will be determined by the total of the marks obtained in the written examination and in the interview. Candidates must obtain such a total of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Commissioners.

(ii) Of the vacancies to be filled not less than one-tenth will be reserved for candidates who reach a standard satisfactory to the Commissioners and who

(a) have completed, by 1st September, 1955, a period of not less than three years' continuous full-time service in H.M. Forces of which not less than one year must have been whole-time voluntary service entered into for a fixed period (including in the case of officers a permanent commission); or

(b) have contracted to complete a fixed period of whole-time voluntary service (including in the case of officers a permanent commission) which would have qualified under (a) and been invalidated before completing that period; or

(c) have contracted to complete in the Royal Air Force a fixed period of whole-time voluntary service (including in the case of officers a permanent commission) which would have qualified under (a) and been released, with full terminal benefits, before completing that period, under special arrangements made by the Air Ministry for those returning from service overseas near the end of their engagement.

No candidate will be eligible for inclusion in this reservation if his whole-time service ceased more than two years before 1st September, 1955.

8. Candidates Trained as Teachers.

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be

appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners

9. Fee.

(MADE 10th AUGUST, 1955)

The Swine Fever (Infected Districts) Order, 1955 prescribes that in certain areas set out in the First Schedule no sale or gathering of swine shall be held in any market fairground or saleyard unless the holding thereof is authorised by the Local Authority. Only fat swine for immediate slaughter may be included in such sales. The movement of swine into, out of and within the areas is also regulated. This Order, which came into operation on 12th August 1955, withdraws the restrictions from the county of Essex and the County Boroughs of East Ham, Southend-on-Sea and West Ham.
