NOTE.—The following diseases were eradicated from Great Britain in the years indicated:—Cattle plague or rinder-pest (*pestis bovina*), 1877; pleuro-pneumonia (*peripneumonia contagiosa bovum*), 1898; sheep pox (*variola ovium*), 1850; rabies, 1922; epizootic lymphangitis (*lymphangitis epizootica*), 1906; glanders (including farcy) (*malleus*), 1928; and parasitic mange (*psoroptes et sarcopites scabiei equi*), 1948. Dourine (*exanthema coitale paralyticum*) has never existed in Great Britain.

HERRING INDUSTRY SCHEME 1951

NOTICE OF DIRECTIONS

THE Herring Industry Board hereby give notice that, by virtue of the powers vested in them by the above Scheme, they have this day made Directions numbered and having the effect as under:

- No. 4 55 prohibits the curing of herring in Great Britain between certain dates ;
No. 5 55 prohibits the curing in Great Britain and Northern Ireland of certain classes of herring between certain dates ;
Nos. 6/55 specify the classes of herring that may be sold and 7 55 on first sales in Great Britain and Northern Ireland between certain dates.

Copies of the Directions may be inspected at any office of the Board or at the office of an Inspector of Fisheries or Fishery Officer of the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and of the Scottish Home Department or Ministry of Commerce (Government of Northern Ireland), or will be sent post free on application to me.
