DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT, 1950

NOTICE is hereby given in pursuance of Section 85(3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950, that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State for Scotland acting jointly have made the following Order:—

*Statutory Instruments 1955 No. 1687
The Live Poultry (Mid Norfolk) Order, 1955
(Made 4th November, 1955)*

This Order, which came into operation on 9th November,

1955, prohibits the movement of live poultry into, out of and within the area in Norfolk and East Suffolk specified in the First Schedule. The holding of markets of store poultry and exhibitions of poultry for show purposes in the said area is also prohibited. Poultry intended for immediate slaughter may, however, be moved within the area if accompanied by a licence issued by the Local Authority and provided the tail feathers of the birds are clipped back in the manner prescribed in the licence.
