TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. - (a) in paragraph (c) of Regulation (2) for the words "for a longer period than 20 minutes" there were substituted the words "for a longer period than 30 minutes"; and

- 4. The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
