THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, the following amendment has been made in the Regulations for the recruitment to the Patent Examiner Class dated the 4th March, 1955, and published in the *London Gazette* of the same date, viz.:—

Regulation 4 (a) (ii) is modified as follows:—

“Every candidate must have obtained a university degree with first or second class honours, preferably in Physics, organic or inorganic Chemistry, Electrical or Mechanical Engineering or in Mathematics, or an equivalent qualification, but for a limited number of vacancies candidates with first or second class honours degrees in other subjects scientific or otherwise—will be considered.”
