THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury kreby give notice that They have made an Order under the 2nd Schedule to the Finance Act, 1957 entitled The Composite Goods Order 1957.

This Order sets out average rates of customs duty to be charged on composite goods of the descriptions which it specifies, in respect of any sugar, molasses, glucose, cocoa or hydrocarbon oils contained in them as ingredients. The aver ge rates will be chargeable in lieu of the precisely calculated amounts hitherto charged in respect of the ingredients contained in any particular importation of those composite goods.

The Order also specifies descriptions of goods which are to be treated for the purposes of customs duty as not con-taining a particular ingredient, where only an insignificant amount of duty would be chargeable in respect of it, and of goods which are to be treated as consisting wholly of a particular ingredient, where that ingredient substantially determines the nature and use of the goods.

The Order comes into operation on the 1st September, 1957 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1957, No. 1493.
