## SCHEDULE B.

## "1. Abolition of Seven Year Rule.

As from 3rd September, 1956, the following Clause is to be substituted for Clause 3 of the Schedule to Order in Council of 7th November, 1924:-
'3. The grant of a pension, allowance or gratuity under these regulations will only be allowable provided that the Seaman or Marine was killed or drowned in the service of the Crown or died as the result of wound, injury or disease directly attributable to the conditions of service.'
"2. Revised rates of widows' pensions and children's allowances.
(A) As from 1st May, 1952, the following Clause is to be substituted for Clause 1 of Schedule B of Order in Council of 29th November, 1946:-

(E) As from 1st January, 1947, the rate of 26s. Od. a week to be payable for an incapacitated motherless child between the ages of 18 and 21 years. This rate to be increased to 32 s . 6d. a week as from 21st July, 1952, and to be further increased to 40 s . 0 d . a week as from 3 rd February, 1955.
"3. Step child and legally adopted child.
As from 1st February, 1948, the following sub-clause to be substituted for sub-clauses ( $a$ ) and ( $b$ ) of Clause 17 of Schedule B to Order in Council of 9th May, 1940, as amended by Order in Council of 29th November, 1946:-
' $(a)$ and ( $b$ ) For a step child or legally adopted child, the child shall have been regularly maintained in whole or in part by the Seaman or Marine up to the date of his death.'
"4. Rent Allowance.
(A) As from 7th June, 1951, the amount of 8s. 0d. shown in Clause 5 (i) of Schedule B to Order in Council of 29th November, $1946_{z}$ to be 6 s .0 d .
(B) As from 9th August, 1956, the maximum rate of rent allowance shown in Clause $5(v)$ of Schedule B to Order in Council of 29 th November, 1946, to be increased from 15 s . Od. a week to 20 s . 0d. a week.

SCHEDULE C.
"Pensions and Allowances for Disabled Officers.
"1. Disability Additions to Retired Pay.
The following rates of additional retired pay for disability are to be substituted for the scales shown in Clauses 1 and 2 of Schedule 1 to Order in Council of 11th October, 1923.

1. Commissioned Officers (except Senior Commissioned Officers and Commissioned Officers, Branch List) entitled to retired pay in respect of service.
