TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Thursday, the 3rd April, 1958, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £260,000,000.

WAGES COUNCILS ACTS, 1945 to 1948

LAUNDRY WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN)

THE Laundry Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby give notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Laundry Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation Order, 1956 (Order W.(78)), as amended by the Wages Regulation (Laundry) (Amendment) Order, 1957 (Order W.(80)), and (2) the revocation of Order W.(78) and Order W.(80).

Civil Service Commission, 28th March, 1958.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF INSTRUCTORS (INSTRUCTIONAL OFFICERS GRADES III AND IV) AND OCCUPATIONAL SUPERVISORS (INSTRUCTIONAL OFFICERS GRADE II) UNDER THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL SERVICE.

1. Both men and women are eligible.

2. There are no age limits, but the Department expects regular and effective service for a reasonable period, and this requirement will be taken into account.

3. Nationality.

To be eligible for appointment a candidate must be a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic and in addition satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) if he was a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth—

(i) at least one of his parents must be, or have been at death, a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic, or

(ii) the candidate must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment;

(b) if he was not a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth, he must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment;

(c) if not qualified under sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, he must satisfy the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

4. Candidates must be (a) experienced and fully-skilled in their particular trade, craft or subject, (b) able to teach their trade, craft or subject, and (c) able to supervise the work, and maintain control of trainees engaged in their trade, craft or subject.

Candidates should have undergone the training usual in their particular trade, craft or subject, followed by practical experience on fully-skilled work for a reasonable number of years (normally not less than five years in a craft trade). These provisions may be waived only exceptionally for individual candidates whose training in the trade, craft or subject and practical experience are comparable to the qualifications normally required. It is desirable for candidates for posts in Grade III to be in possession of an Ordinary National Certificate or City and Guilds Certificate or equivalent qualifications in the appropriate subject, where such qualifications exist.

5. The candidates who appear from their applications to have the best qualifications and experience may be required to take a trade test, if one has been prescribed, and will be summoned to interview before a Selection Board which will recommend for the vacancy the candidate who seems to be most suitable.

6. Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widowed or divorced or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible for appointment to the established staff unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid; provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

7. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment.

8. The necessary number of candidates will be appointed in an unestablished capacity subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they are eligible for appointment in respect of age, nationality, health and character and to the payment of a fee of 10s. for Grade III and 1s. for Grade IV.

9. After a minimum qualifying period of two years' unestablished service in the grade of Instructors and Occupational Supervisors appointed under these regulations may be considered for appointment to the established staff as and when vacancies occur thereon, if they are recommended by their Department as qualified in other respects. Those so considered will appear before a final Selection Board set up by the Civil Service Commissioners, which will recommend to the Commissioners the Candidates who appear to be qualified.

10. Before an Instructor or Occupational Supervisor is appointed to the established staff, the Civil Service Commissioners must issue a certificate of qualification: a further fee as follows is payable before the certificate of qualification can be issued:—

Grade III. £2 being the balance of the fee of £2, 10s.
Grade IV. £1, 15s., being the balance of the fee of £2.
