THE TRUNK ROADS (TURNHOUSE) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING ORDER, 1958

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he has made an Order under section 46(2) of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, the effect of which is set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

From 1st May, 1958 no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in that length of the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (Route A.9) at Turnhouse Aerodrome in the County of Midlothian which extends from a point 110 yards or thereby east of its junction with Eastfield Road (Class III) to Gogar Burn Bridge, a distance of 233 yards.

Exceptions have been made in the Order to enable vehicles to wait for so long as may be necessary for persons to board or alight, to load or unload goods or to be used in connection with building or demolition operations, the removal of any obstruction to traffic or the maintenance of the road or services thereon.

GEORGE STREET, OBAN, PROHIBITION OF WAITING

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 46(2) of the Road Traffic Act, 1930 as amended, the effect of which is set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

The Order will prohibit between 1st April and 31st October in each year the waiting of vehicles in George Street, Oban:—

- 1) from Stafford Street to William Street between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. (a) on the east side on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays or for more than 20 minutes in any hour on any other week-day and (b) on the west side on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays or for more than 20 minutes in any hour on any other week-day;
- (2) on the east side from Stevenson Street to Stafford Street on any week-day for more than 20 minutes in any hour.
- 3) on the west side from Queens Park Place for a distance of 167 yards or thereby in a northerly direction.

Exceptions will be made in the Order to enable vehicles to wait for so long as may be necessary for persons to board or alight, to load or unload goods or to be used in connection with building or demolition operations, the removal of any obstruction to traffic or the maintenance of the road or services thereon.
