SEEDS ACT, 1920: GENERAL LICENCE FOR GRASS  
AND CLOVER SEEDS

THE sale of seeds under the Seeds Act, 1920, as amended by the Agriculture (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1954, requires a statement to be delivered to the purchaser within seven days of the sale or delivery of the seed giving certain specified particulars about the seeds sold, including a declaration of germination. The result of a germination test is not, however, available in less than 15-22 days for most grass seeds and within 11 days for clover seeds, and in order to comply with the requirements of the Act, seedsmen may on occasion be obliged to delay the delivery of seed to farmers, particularly when seed has newly arrived from abroad or has been recently delivered by growers in the United Kingdom.

Delays in deliveries may cause serious inconvenience to farmers, and the Secretary of State for Scotland has accordingly made a statutory instrument, (The Grass and Clover Seeds (General Licence (Scotland), 1958) under the Act, extending the period for delivery of particulars of germination to 35 days after sale in the case of grass seeds and mixtures of grass seeds and clover seeds, and to 21 days after sale in the case of clover seeds. These extensions only take effect as regards sales in Scotland of seeds specified in the licence made during the periods from April 15 to May 15, 1958, inclusive, and from August 1 to October 15, 1958, inclusive.

All other particulars which have to be declared in the case of a sale of grass or clover seed will still have to be declared to the purchaser by the seller within seven days of the sale or delivery of the seed.
