NATIONAL PARKS AND ACCESS TO THE COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1949 DECLARATION OF THE HERMANESS, CLAIRINSH AND LOCH DRUIDIBEG NATURE RESERVES

NOTICE is Hereby Given, in pursuance of Section 19 of the above-mentioned Act, that by the Hermaness Nature Reserve Declaration, 1958, the Clairinsch Nature Reserve Declaration, 1958, and the Loch Druidibeg Nature Reserve Declaration, 1958, respectively, all made on the eighth day of July, 1958, it was declared by the Nature Conservancy that the lands (First) and (Second) hereinafter described are now the subjects of Agreements entered into with them under the provisions of the Act, and that the land (Third) hereinafter described has been acquired and is being held by them, namely:—

(First) Land extending to 1,312 acres, together with the islands and stacks lying adjacent to the coast thereof, comprising part of the Estate of Bunness, in the Parish of Unst and County of Zetland, shown tinted pink and enclosed within a red line on the map attached to the relative Declaration;

(Second) Land consisting of the Isle of Clairinsch extending to 14.86 acres, lying in Loch Lamond and in the Parish of Buchanan and County of Stirling, shown tinted pink and enclosed within a red line on the map attached to the relative Declaration; and

(Third) Land extending to 2,577 acres on which is situated Loch Druidibeg, and lying in the Island and Parish of South Uist and County of Inverness, shown tinted pink and enclosed within a red line on the map attached to the relative Declaration;

And it was further declared that the whole of the above-mentioned lands are being managed as nature reserves.

NOTICE is Hereby Given, in terms of Section 147 (5) of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1947, that the County Council of the County of Perth have resolved (1) to form the Villages of Abernethven and New Alyth into Special Drainage Districts; (2) to form areas at Ardhair (Blairgowrie), Keltie Bridge (Callander) and Leny Feus (Callander) into Special Lighting Districts; (3) to combine each into one Special District and without any alteration of existing boundaries (a) the Dunkeld and Birnam Special Lighting Districts and (b) the Dunkeld and Birnam Special Scavenging Districts; (4) to alter by extension the boundaries of the Cloncurse Special Drainage District; (5) to alter by contraction the boundaries of the Killin Special Drainage, Lighting and Scavenging Districts; and (6) to adopt within each of the foregoing Special Districts certain provisions of the Burgh Police (Scotland) Act, 1892.
