TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED MEAT) (SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS, 1937 to 1948

THE Secretary of State for Scotland gives notice in pursuance of the above-named Regulations that he hereby recognises the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as showing (a) that the meat, from which the meat product to which the Certificate relates was prepared, was derived from animals inspected ante and post mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Secretary of State; and (b) that all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health were taken in the preparing and packing of the meat product.

The Certificate being in the form of a label or stamp, recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to, or the stamp is clearly impressed on, the package containing the meat product and the label or stamp has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.

The label or stamp hereby recognised is in substitution for the label or stamp recognised as an Official Certificate in the Notice published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* of 1st December, 1950, which is hereby revoked as from 31st July, 1958.

ROYAL BURGH OF ARBROATH

EXTENSION OF BURGH BOUNDARIES

A PETITION has been presented in the Sheriff Court of Perth and Angus at Arbroath by the Provost, Magistrates and Councillors of the Royal Burgh of Arbroath, Petitioners, against the County Council of the County of Angus, Respondents, wherein the Petitioners crave the Court

(1) To alter the boundary of the Royal Burgh of Arbroath by extending the said boundary to include within the said Burgh the following three areas of ground, videlicet:—

(First) That area of ground containing 9,008 acres or thereby Imperial Standard Measure shown coloured blue on the reproduction of the Ordnance Survey Map (Scale Six Inches to One Statute Mile) marked "Royal Burgh of Arbroath, Map showing proposed extension of Burgh Boundaries, 1958" herewith produced and hereinafter referred to as "the said Map" and extending as follows:—commencing at a point on the existing boundary of the said Burgh marked "A" on the said Map, said point "A" is on the iron straining post of the fence forming the south boundary of the main railway line running between Aberdeen and Dundee (formerly known as the Dundee and Arbroath Joint Railway Line) hereinafter referred to as the "said railway line" a distance of 1 foot 4 inches or thereby from the south east corner of the east gate post of the south gate leading across the said railway line; thence in a north westerly direction for a distance of 1 foot 4 inches or thereby and then in a south westerly direction along the fence forming the south boundary of the said railway line for a distance of 1032 feet 3 inches or thereby to a point marked "B" on the said Map; thence in a south easterly direction along the centre line of the Elliot Water and across the foreshore all for a distance of 507 feet or thereby to a point marked "C" on the said Map; thence in a north easterly direction along the foreshore at the High Water Mark of Ordinary Spring Tides for a distance of 750 feet or thereby to a point on the existing Burgh Boundary marked "D" on the said Map; thence in a north westerly direction along the existing Burgh Boundary to the point of commencement marked "A" on the said Map;

(Second) That area of ground containing 104,362 acres or thereby Imperial Standard Measure shown coloured yellow on the said Map and extending as follows:—commencing at the aforementioned point on the existing boundary of the said Burgh marked "A" on the said Map thence in a north westerly direction across the said railway line and the Dundee Road (Route A92), next in a north easterly direction and then in a north westerly direction along the line of a stone wall and fence all for a distance of 2983 feet 11 inches or thereby

including an inset of 4 feet 7 inches or thereby, to a point marked "E" on the said Map, thence in a north easterly, next in an easterly and again in a north easterly direction along the centre line of a ditch all for a distance of 2058 feet 11 inches or thereby to a point on the existing burgh boundary marked "F" on the said Map, said point "F" is located at the centre of the junction of the said ditch with Geordie's Burn; thence in a south easterly direction along the existing burgh boundary to a point marked "G" on the said Map and thence in a south westerly direction along the existing burgh boundary to the point of commencement marked "A" on the said Map and

(Third) That area of ground containing 43,455 acres or thereby Imperial Standard Measure shown coloured green on the said Map and extending as follows:—commencing at a point on the existing boundary of the said Burgh marked "H" on the said Map, said point "H" is at the junction of a drystone dyke forming the existing boundary of the said Burgh and a drystone dyke forming the west boundary of Seaton Road; thence in a north easterly direction along the line of a drystone dyke for a distance of 799 feet or thereby to a point marked "I" on the said Map; thence in a south easterly direction across Seaton Road, then along the line of a stone wall, a drystone dyke and the centre line of a bank all for a distance of 1407 feet 7 inches or thereby to a point marked "K" on the said Map; again in a north easterly direction along the centre line of a ditch for a distance of 10 feet or thereby to a point marked "L" on the said Map; thence in a south easterly direction along the line of a fence and across Cliffburn Road all for a distance of 1848 feet 11 inches or thereby to a point marked "M" on the said Map; thence in a south westerly direction along the line of a drystone dyke forming the south boundary of Cliffburn Road for a distance of 526 feet 3 inches or thereby to a point on the existing Burgh Boundary marked "N" on the said Map, said point "N" is located on the south boundary drystone dyke of Cliffburn Road at a distance of 183 feet 8 inches or thereby from the point where the centre line of St. Murdoch's Crescent produced meets the south boundary fence of Cliffburn Road; thence in a north westerly direction along the existing Burgh Boundary to a point of commencement marked "H" on the said Map.

- (1) To alter two of the Ward Boundaries of the said Burgh as follows:—by including in the Second (West) Ward the said areas of ground extending to 9,008 acres or thereby and 104,362 acres or thereby described (First) and (Second) respectively in crave (1) hereof and also by including in the Third (East) Ward the said area of ground extending to 43,455 acres or thereby described (Third) in crave (1) hereof.
- (2) To direct that there shall be no alteration in the order of retreat of Councillors holding office in each or any of the Wards of the Burgh.
- (3) To direct that the alteration of the said burgh boundary by the inclusion in the said Burgh of the three areas of ground described in crave (1) hereof and the consequent adjustment of the Second (West) Ward and Third (East) Ward boundaries shall take effect as from 16th May, 1958.
- (4) To find the Respondents or any persons so appearing to oppose the Petition liable in expenses.
