The Secretary of State is not in all cases required to afford to a person making an objection, an opportunity of appearing before and being heard by a person appointed by him for that purpose. It is important, therefore, that the grounds upon which an objection is made should be stated in full as the objector may have no further opportunity of making such a statement.

Any owner or occupier of any land to which the Order relates may send to the Cumbernauld Development Corporation at the address below, a request in writing to serve him with a Notice that the Order has been confirmed and naming a place where copies of the Order and of the map may be seen.
