TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946 SPECIAL ROADS ACT, 1949

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he has made "The London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (Gien Loth Road and other Improvements) Order, 1958," under section 14 of the Special Roads Act. 1949, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955, which trunk read Order provides for (a) the construction by the Sometary of State of three new reads in substitution for a length of Gien Loth Road and a length and parts of the Lendon-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road in the Courny of Stherland to be stopped up by the Order, (b) the stopping up of a length of Gien Loth Road and a length and three parts of the said Trunk Road when the said new roads are opened for the purposes of through traffic and (c) the Sutherland County Council becoming the highway authority for the new roads on the date when the Secretary of State thorigh traffic.
