The QUEEN having been pleased to approve the appointment of Lieutenant-Colonel James Hamilton Hicks, T.D., D.L., to be Vice-Lieutenant of the County of Bute, a Commission in his favour bearing date the 5th September, 1958, has been signed by the Lord Lieutenant.

TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946 SPECIAL ROADS ACT, 1949

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he has made "The London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (Glen Loth Road and other Improvements) Order, 1958," under section 14 of the Special Roads Act, 1949, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955, which trunk road Order provides for (a) the construction by the Secretary of State of three new roads in substitution for a length of Glen Loth Road and a length and parts of the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road in the County of Sutherland to be stopped up by the Order, (b) the stopping up of a length of Glen Loth Road and a length and three parts of the said Trunk Road when the said new roads are opened for the purposes of through traffic and (c) the Sutherland County Council becoming the highway authority for the new roads on the date when the Secretary of State notifies the Council that the new roads are opened for through traffic.

Copies of the Order and of the relative plan have been deposited at the Scottish Home Department, Bankhead Avenue, Sighthill, Edinburgh, 11, from whom copies of the Order can be obtained, and at the offices of the Sutherland County Council, County Offices, Golspie, and may be seen at all reasonable hours.

Any Person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the statutory powers or on the ground that any requirement of the said Act of 1949 or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks of the twelfth day of September, 1958, apply to the Court of Session for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
