TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946  
SPECIAL ROADS ACT, 1949

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he has made "The Glasgow-Greenock-Monkton Trunk Road (Dubbs Road and other Improvements) Order, 1958," under section 14 of the Special Roads Act, 1949, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955, which trunk road Order provides for (a) the improvement by realignment and regrading of a length of Dubbs Road and two lengths of Nethermains Road, near Kilwinning, in the County of Ayr, (b) the construction by the Secretary of State of six new roads in substitution for those lengths of Dubbs Road, Byrehill Road, Nethermains Road and Watercut Road to be stopped up by the Order, (c) the stopping up of lengths of Dubbs Road, Byrehill Road, Nethermains Road and Watercut Road when the said new roads are opened for the purposes of through traffic and (d) Ayr County Council becoming the highway authority for the new roads on the date when the Secretary of State notifies the Council that the new roads are opened for through traffic.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1956  
30 m.p.h. SPEED LIMIT ORDER
