UNLICENSED PLACE OF REFRESHMENT WAGES BOARD

THE Unlicensed Place of Refreshment Wages Board hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for (1) revising the provisions of the Wages Regulation (Unlicensed Place of Refreshment) Order, 1957 (Order U.P.R.(23)) and increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out

therein; (2) amending the provisions relating to holidays and holiday remuneration set out in the Wages Regulation (Unlicensed Place of Refreshment) (Holidays) Order, 1957 (Order U.P.R.(24)); and (3) the revocation of Order U.P.R.(23) and Order U.P.R.(24).
