(1) No person shall drive or mause or permit to be driven any vehicle the weight of which whether laden or unladen exceeds ten tons on so much of the Bonnyrigg-Cockpen-Gorebridge Road (Route B, 704) as is carried by the Dalhousie Bridge over the River South Esk in the Parish of Cockpen within the County of Midlothian.

(2) No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle on the length of road specified in (1) above at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour.
