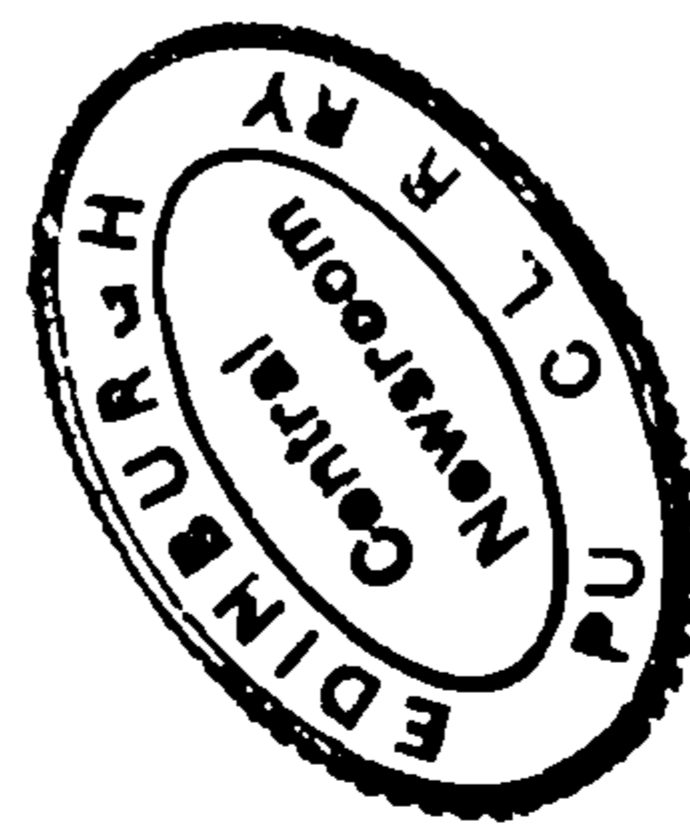

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 5 of the Import Duties Act, 1958 as extended by Section 9 of the Finance Act, 1959.
viz.:—

The Import Duty Reliefs (No. 1) Order, 1959, which provides for the relief from protective duty chargeable under the Import Duties Act, 1958, of herrings imported or (within certain limits) purchased after importation for conversion into meal and oil.

The Order comes into operation on the 31st August, 1959 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1959, No. 1505.

This Order, which comes into operation on 13th December, 1959 alters the requirements of the Importation of Carcasses and Animal Products Order, 1954, relating to meat, including edible offals, imported into Great Britain from Argentina, Brazil, Chile and Uruguay. The new requirement is that each consignment must be accompanied by a certificate that it has been exported from recognised frigorifices.
