NATIONAL PARKS AND ACCESS TO THE COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1949 DECLARATIONS OF KIRKCONNELL FLOW AND HAAF GRUNEY NATURE RESERVES

NOTICE is Hereby Given, in pursuance of Section 19 of the above-mentioned Act, that by the Kirkconnell Flow Nature Reserve Declaration, 1959, and the Haaf Gruney Nature Reserve Declaration, 1959, both made on the twenty-third day of September, 1959, it was declared by the Nature Conservancy that the lands (first) and (second) hereinafter described are now the subjects of Agreements entered into with them under the provisions of the Act, namely:—

(First) Land known as Kirkconnell Flow extending to 383 acres or thereby in the Parish of Troqueer and the Stewartry of Kirkcudbright, as shown tinted pink and outlined red on the map attached to the relative Declaration, and

(Second) Land consisting of the Island of Haaf Gruney, and the small islands or skerries adjacent in the Parish of Unst and County of Zetland, as shown tinted pink and enclosed within a red line on the map attached to the relative Declaration.

And it was further declared that both the above-mentioned lands are being managed as nature reserves.
