### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, 6th May 1960, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £250,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 9th May 1960 to Saturday, the 14th May 1960, inclusive and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m.

(Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made Regulations under Sections 1 and 5 of the Income Tax (Repayment of Post-War Credits) Act, 1959, viz.:

The Post-War Credit (Income Tax) Amendment Regulations, 1960.

These Regulations prescribe additional qualifications to receive repayment of Post-War Credits.

The new classes who qualify from 16th May 1960, are set out in Regulation 3 and are:

(1) *Sickness*: persons who for a continuous period of 26 weeks ending after 4th April 1960, have been receiving sickness or industrial injury benefit, or who would have been receiving such benefit but for special arrangements made with their employers, or who have been in-patients in hospitals or nursing homes;

- (2) *Disability*: persons who after 4th April 1960, are receiving war or industrial injuries disability pensions in respect of assessments of one hundred per cent., or an allowance under the Workmen's Compensation and Benefit (Supplementation) Act, 1956, or the Workmen's Compensation (Supplementation) Act (Northern Ireland), 1956 ;
- (3) *Unemployment*: persons who for a continuous period of 26 weeks ending after 4th April 1960, have been registered as unemployed ;
- (e) *Widowhood*: a person who at any time after 4th April 1960, is a widow.

In groups (1) to (3) the responsible authority, which is defined where necessary under Regulation 2, will certify the facts on which the claim is based.

The Regulations come into force on 16th May 1960, but no payment of Credits will be made by virtue of these Regulations before 13th June 1960.

Provision is also made for disregarding intervals up to a total of six days (excluding Sundays) in certifying a continuous period of 26 weeks and for combining periods of sickness, unemployment and national assistance, so as to enable a person to qualify in respect of a total continuous period of 26 weeks.

## THE NATIONAL INSURANCE (NON-PARTICIPATION—BENEFITS AND SCHEMES) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS, 1960

IN accordance with Section 77 of the National Insurance Act, 1946, the National Insurance Advisory Committee give notice that they have received from the Minister of Pensions and National Insurance for consideration and report thereon the preliminary draft of regulations entitled the National Insurance (Non-participation—Benefits and Schemes) Amendment Regulations, 1960.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

These Regulations amend the National Insurance (Non-participation—Benefits and Schemes) Regulations, 1959, by allowing the recognition of certain pension schemes or arrangements for the purposes of the National Insurance Act, 1959, notwithstanding that their benefits may be terminated under the Forfeiture Act, 1870, or suspended during employment in public or local government service. Provision is also made for recognising the pension arrangements of the staff of the Houses of Parliament.
