PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 3rd day of August 1960.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas by Order in Council dated the 22nd day of March 1911, it was provided that a certain water area at Gibraltar should be placed under the jurisdiction of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and that powers should be conferred on them to make Regulations for the proper control of the same:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 27th day of October 1936, it was provided that the limits of the said water area should be more accurately defined:

And whereas it is expedient, for the further development of the Mercantile Port of Gibraltar, that provision should be made for the Government of Gibraltar to make laws for the control of merchant vessels within Port Waters in the limits of the said water area and for the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Gibraltar to exercise the jurisdiction and control of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty over merchant vessels in the said water area:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of all the powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Admiralty Waters (Gibraltar) Order, 1960, and may be cited together with the Order in Council dated 22nd March 1911, and the Order in Council dated the 27th October 1936, as the Admiralty Waters (Gibraltar) Orders, 1911 to 1960.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on the 15th day of August 1960.

2.—(1) Paragraph 1 of the Order in Council dated 22nd March 1911, shall be amended by re-numbering the existing paragraph as sub-paragraph (1) of Paragraph 1 and by inserting the following new sub-paragraph:

“(2) The water area to the East of the Western Arm of the North Mole extending from low-water mark for a width of 168 yards, the water area extending for a width of 50 yards outside the faced wall of the North Mole and the water area extending from low-water mark 200 feet Eastwards from the two North-East berths on the Detached Mole, which said water areas form part of Admiralty Waters and the boundaries of which are delineated on the Chart annexed to this Order, shall be deemed to be Port Waters.”

(2) The Chart annexed to this Order shall be deemed to be annexed to the said Order in Council.

3. There shall be inserted, after Paragraph 4 of the said Order in Council, a new paragraph 4A, as follows:

“4A. Notwithstanding anything in this Order, the Senior Naval Officer or the person performing the duties of Queen's Harbour Master may consent to the exercise by the Governor of Gibraltar, or such persons as the said Governor may appoint, of his jurisdiction, control, powers and duties under this Order and under any Regulations made under this Order, subject to such conditions and modifications as he may think fit, in respect of any vessel or class of vessel other than vessels the property of or under charter to Her Majesty, whilst in Admiralty Waters other than Port Waters, which seeks to enter, leave or make use of Port Waters.”

4. Paragraph 5 of the said Order in Council shall be amended by inserting, after the word “shall” in line 2, the words “except as otherwise provided in this Order.”

5. Paragraph 7 of the said Order in Council shall be revoked and there shall be substituted the following paragraph:

“7. Notwithstanding anything in this Order, all merchant and other private vessels within Port Waters shall be subject to such laws as the Colonial Government of Gibraltar may enact for the control of such vessels therein.”

6. In Paragraph 14 of the said Order in Council (which provides for a fine not exceeding £20 in respect of the contravention of any rule or regulation) “£50” shall be substituted for “£20.”
