

# STOPPING UP OF A HIGHWAY AT THE ROYAL NAVAL AIR STATION, ABBOTSINCH, RENFREWSHIRE

THE Secretary of State for Scotland hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 46 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act, 1947, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955, and section 8 of the Land Powers (Defence) Act, 1958, authorising the stopping up until 31st December 1964, of a length of Walkinshaw Road at the Royal Naval Air Station, Abbotsinch, Renfrewshire and requiring the restoration of the road by the Admiralty at the expiry of the period of stopping up.

Copies of the Order and relative plan may be inspected at the Scottish Home Department, Bankhead Avenue, Sighthill, Edinburgh 11, or at the Renfrew County Council Offices, County Buildings, Paisley.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of Part III of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act, 1947, or that any requirement of Schedule VI of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within six weeks from 19th August 1960, apply to the Court of Session for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

## NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACT 1952

PURSUANT to section 275(5) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952 and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, an "Oldsmobile" motor car, engine No. V.440826, Chassis No. 558M.7027, registration No. 2P 3059, account No. 25-41067A. has been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that —being goods chargeable with a duty of customs, it was allowed to be delivered, at Liverpool on 28th July 1959, without payment of that duty upon condition that it would be re-exported from the United Kingdom before the expiration on 27th October 1959 of the triptyque relating thereto or when the importer's temporary stay in the United Kingdom came to an end, whichever was the earlier date and such condition was not observed.

Whereby and by force of section 257 of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952, the said car is liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said car is not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act specifying the name and address of a solicitor in Scotland who is authorised to accept service of process and to act on your behalf, in default of such notice the said car will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.

### ARGYLL COUNTY COUNCIL WHITEHOUSE RURAL WATER SUPPLY
