### SCHEDULE

The Order would prohibit the waiting of vehicles from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Mondays to Saturdays inclusive on Stirling Street, Denny, between Hall Street and Herbertshire Street, on alternate sides of the road on alternate days or for longer than 30 minutes in any hour on the side of the road on which waiting is not, for the time being, prohibited.

Exceptions would be provided in the Order to enable vehicles to wait for so long as might be necessary for persons to board or alight, to load or unload goods or to be used in connection with building or demolition operations, the removal of any obstruction to traffic or the maintenance of the road or services therein.

### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the

Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

THE NATIONAL INSURANCE (MARINERS) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS, 1960

IN accordance with Section 77 of the National Insurance Act, 1946, the National Insurance Advisory Committee give notice that they have received from the Minister of Pensions and National Insurance for consideration and report thereon the preliminary draft of regulations entitled the National Insurance (Mariners) Amendment Regulations, 1960.

A short explanatory note on these regulations is appended to this notice.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

These Regulations amend the National Insurance (Mariners) Regulations, 1948, by making provisions relating to any period of leave on pay at the end of a mariner's voyage. The mariner and his employer are to pay contributions as if the mariner's employment had continued throughout any such period; and, if the mariner becomes employed again during the period, both he and his employer in the new employment are to have the right to pay contributions in respect of the new employment during the period of leave on pay, and any mariner's contributions so paid may be re-allocated or repaid.

The Regulations also add provisions which modify and supplement, in regard to a seaman, provisions in sections 1 and 2 of the National Insurance Act, 1959, determining liability for graduated contributions. They prescribe the manner in which contributions payable are to be calculated and specify the payments which are not to be taken into account in deciding, for graduated contribution purposes, the amount of a seaman's remuneration.

#### THE FACTORIES ACT, 1959 (COMMENCEMENT No. 4) ORDER, 1960

THE Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that on 6th October 1960 he made the Factories Act, 1959 (Commencement No. 4) Order, 1960, (S.I. 1960 No. 1839 (C.17)) bringing into operation on 1st December 1960, the following sections of the Factories Act, 1959:

Section nine concerning the exercise by fire authorities of functions relating to means of escape in case of fire; section ten concerning means of escape in case of fire; section eleven relating to the prevention of fire; section twelve on fire fighting; section thirteen concerning safety provisions in case of fire; section fourteen conferring power to extend provisions as to fire warnings and means of escape in case of fire; section fifteen regarding the extension to other premises, etc., of regulations under sections eleven and twelve; section sixteen concerning the testing or examination of fire warnings; section seventeen on the power of entry of officers of fire authorities, etc.; section twenty-four relating to tenement factories and parts of buildings let off as separate factories; sub-section (2) of section thirty-four (short title, citation, repeal, commencement and extent) in so far as that sub-section relates to sections thirty-four, thirty-six, one hundred and one, one hundred and two and one hundred and sixteen of the Factories Act, 1937; the First Schedule concerning modifications of certain provisions in relation to factories occupying parts of buildings, and part I (enactments repealed) of the Third Schedule in so far as it relates to sections thirty-four, thirty-six, one hundred and one, one hundred and two and one hundred and sixteen of the Factories Act, 1937.
