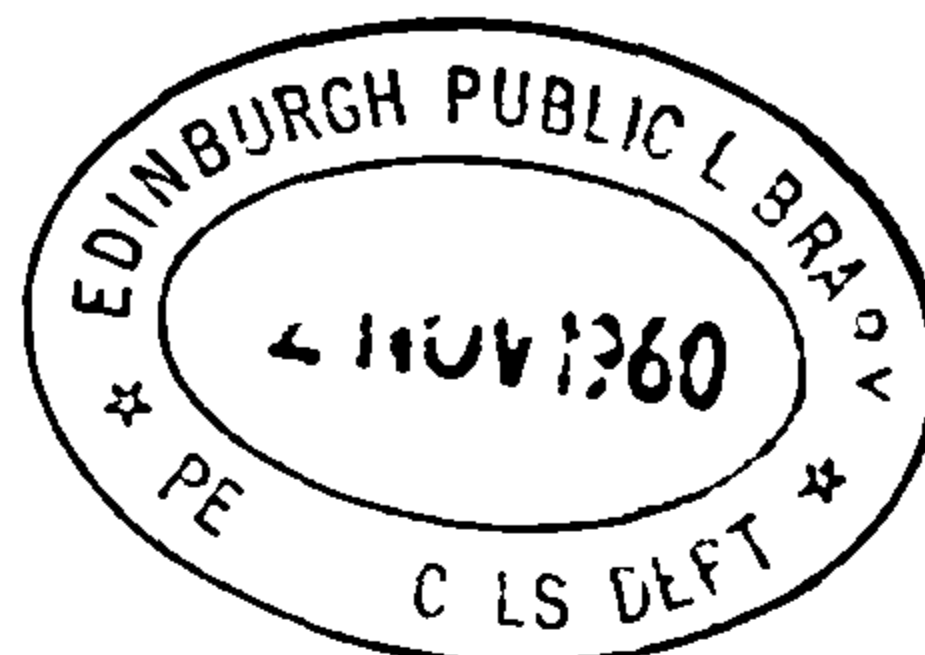

EXTENSION OF SPEED LIMIT—KILMARNOCK ROAD, MONKTON

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1960—SECTIONS 19 & 20

THE Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order, the effect of which will be that the following road shall become subject to the 30 m.p.h. speed limit:

The Stranraer-Glasgow-Stirling Trunk Road (Route A.77) at Monkton, from a point 185 yards or thereby north-east of its junction with the Glasgow-Greenock-Monkton Trunk Road (Route A.78) north-eastwards for a distance of 280 yards or thereby.

Any objection to the making of the Order should be sent in writing to the Secretary, Scottish Home Department, St. Andrew's House, Edinburgh 1, not later than 24th November 1960, quoting the reference 825/64/2 and stating the grounds of objection.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Sections 1, 2 and 13 of the Import Duties Act, 1958, viz.: the Import Duties (General) (No. 11) Order, 1960.

This Order removes the import duty on certain flake graphite and anhydrous borax.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 4th November 1960, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £30,000,000 for Bills due 63 days after date and to the amount of £250,000,000 for Bills due 91 days after date.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 7th November 1960, to Saturday, the 12th November 1960, inclusive.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
