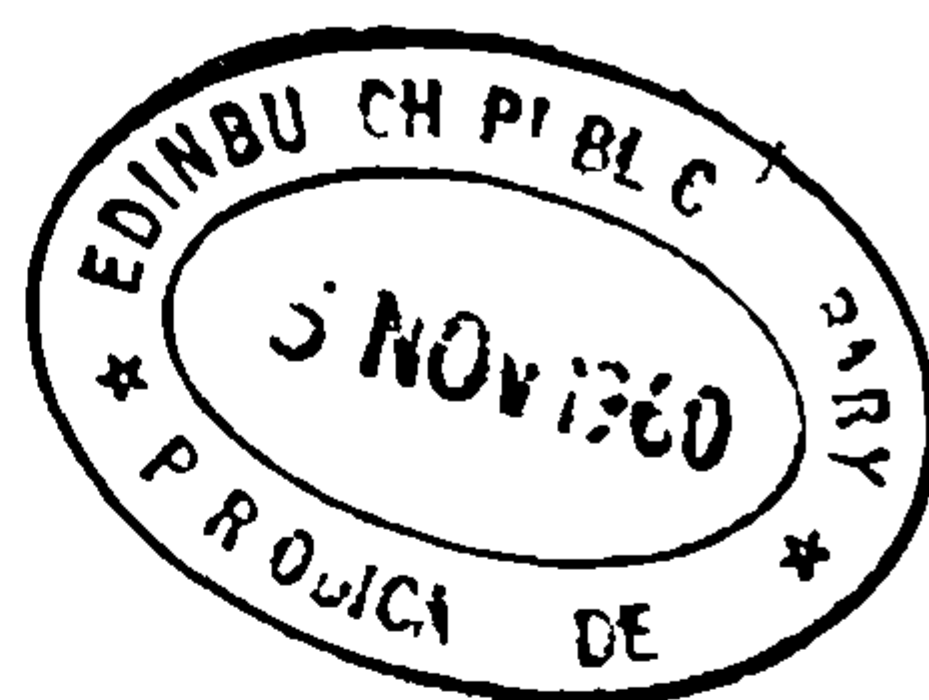

**TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946
SPECIAL ROADS ACT, 1949
CROSSGATES, COWDENBEATH AND KELTY
BYPASS—STAGE 1**

THE Secretary of State gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

1. An Order under section 1 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, as extended by section 14 of the Special Roads Act, 1949 both as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955, the effect of which will be that a diversion which he proposes to construct north of the Burgh of Inverkeithing in the County of Fife will become a trunk road on the date when the Order comes into operation and the length of the trunk road to be superseded thereby will cease to be a trunk road on the sixteenth day of May next after the date on which notice is given by the Secretary of State to the Fife County Council (who will thereafter become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the said diversion is opened for through traffic.

2. An Order under section 14 of the Special Roads Act, 1949, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955, to provide for (a) the improvement by realignment and regrading of a length of the Dunfermline-Hillend Road (B.916) in the said County, (b) the construction by the Secretary of State of a new road in substitution for that length of the Dunfermline-Hillend Road (B.916) authorised to be stopped up by the Order, (c) the stopping up of a length of the Dunfermline-Hillend Road (B.916) when the said new road is opened for the purposes of through traffic and (d) the Fife County Council becoming the highway authority for the new road on the date on which notice is given by the Secretary of State to the Council that the new road is opened for the purposes of through traffic.

Copies of the draft Orders, relative plans and an explanatory note may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 28th October 1960, to 30th January 1961, at the offices of the Scottish Home Department, Bankhead Avenue, Sighthill, Edinburgh 11, and the Fife County Council, County Buildings, Cupar, and 34 Viewfield Terrace, Dunfermline.

**TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946
DALSHIAN DIVERSION**

1. No person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle
the weight of which, whether laden or unladen, exceeds
10 tons on that part of the Cairndow-Strachur-Toward
Road (A.815) which is carried by the bridge over the
River Eachaig at Cothouse, near Dunoon.
2. The Interpretation Act, 1889 shall apply to the interpre-
tation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of
an Act of Parliament.
3. This Order may be cited as the County of Argyll (Traffic
Regulations) (Cothouse Bridge Order, 1960).

NOTICE is Hereby Given that a Petition has been pre-
sented in the Sheriff Court of Inverness Moray Nairn and
Ross and Cromarty at Dingwall on behalf of the Provost
Magistrates and Councillors of the Burgh of Invergordon,
craving the Court:

"To revise, alter and extend the boundaries of the
Burgh of Invergordon situated in the County of Ross and
Cromarty for the purposes of the Burgh Police (Scotland)
Acts 1892 to 1903, the Housing (Scotland) Acts 1890 to
1950 and the other Acts thereanent and the Local Govern-
ment (Scotland) Acts 1929, 1947 and 1948 so as to include
in the existing Burgh the area of ground in the Parish of
Rosskeen and County of Ross and Cromarty extending to
one hundred and four acres and seven hundred and thirty
decimal or one thousandth parts of an acre Imperial
Standard Measure or thereby, delineated in red on the
Ordnance Survey Plan herewith produced (and hereinafter
referred to as "the map") the said area of ground being
bounded and extending as follows, viz.: commencing at
the point marked A on the map and extending in a north
easterly direction for a distance of eight hundred and eight
feet or thereby to the point marked B, thence in a northerly
direction for a distance of five feet or thereby to the point
marked C, thence in a north easterly direction for a distance
of eight hundred and eighty-seven feet or thereby to the
point marked D, thence in a north westerly direction for a
distance of five hundred and seventy feet or thereby to
the point marked E, thence in a north easterly direction for
a distance of two thousand five hundred and fifty-five feet
six inches or thereby to the point marked F, thence in a
south easterly and easterly direction for a distance in all of
