TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 18th November 1960, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £30,000,000 for Bills due 63 days after date and to the amount of £250,000,000 for Bills due 91 days after date.
2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 21st November 1960, to Saturday, the 26th November 1960, inclusive.
3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

PESTS ACT, 1954

THE RABBIT CLEARANCE (SCOTLAND) (No. 2) ORDER, 1960

IN exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 1 of the Pests Act, 1954(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and, after consultation with persons appearing to him to be representative of the interests in the area to which this Order applies of farmers, owners of agricultural land, and workers employed in agriculture and of the forestry interests in the said area and after giving notice of the proposal to make this Order, the Secretary of State hereby makes the following Order:

(1) This Order may be cited as the Rabbit Clearance (Scotland) (No. 2) Order, 1960 and shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of November 1960.

NOTES

Section 1(2) of the Pests Act, 1954 provides:

“The occupier of any land in a rabbit clearance area shall take such steps as may from time to time be necessary for the killing or taking of wild rabbits living on or resorting to the land and, where it is not reasonably practicable to destroy the wild rabbits living on any part of the land, for the prevention of damage by those rabbits . . .”

#### PRIVATE LEGISLATION PROCEDURE (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1936

NOTICE is hereby given in terms of Section 1 (4) of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act, 1936, that the Secretary of State, the Chairman of Committees of the House of Lords and the Chairman of Ways and Means in the House of Commons having considered representations by the British Transport Commission that it is expedient that the under-mentioned Parliamentary powers to be operative in Scotland and elsewhere which the Commission desire to obtain should be conferred by one enactment have decided that the said powers would more properly be obtained by the promotion of a Private Bill than by the promotion of a Private Bill and of a Provisional Order under the said Act.

#### ROYAL BURGH OF RUTHERGLEN LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1947

- (3) The area within a line commencing at a point on the existing Burgh boundary on the north side of Bankhead Road, thence south-westwards along the north side of Bankhead Road to the point where it meets the east boundary of Bankhead School, thence proceeding northwards along the said east boundary of Bankhead School to the existing Burgh boundary and thence proceeding south-eastwards along the boundary of the existing Burgh to the point of commencement; To alter the contents and boundary of the existing Crosshill Ward of the said Burgh by adding thereto the before-mentioned three areas; Area (1) lying in the Parish of Carmunnock and Areas (2) and (3) lying in the Parish of Rutherglen all in the County of Lanark; And to exclude the following area from the said Burgh and said Crosshill Ward, viz.:

The area within a line commencing at a point on the existing Burgh boundary where the said boundary crosses the east boundary of Bankhead School one hundred and ten yards or thereby north from the junction of said east boundary of Bankhead School with Bankhead Road, thence north-westwards along the existing Burgh boundary to the north-west corner of the boundary of said school thence eastwards and southwards along the boundary of said school to the point of commencement; the proposed extension of the Burgh being the said three areas delineated and coloured red on a map consisting of Ordnance Survey Sheets of Lanarkshire Sheets N.S. 66 S.W. and N.S. 65 N.W., and marked "Area No. 1," "Area No. 2," and "Area No. 3" respectively, the area of the existing Burgh being delineated and shown within the outside edge of the lines coloured blue on said map, the proposed extensions of said Crosshill Ward being the said three areas Nos. 1, 2 and 3 coloured red on said map, and the area proposed to be excluded from the existing Burgh and Crosshill Ward being the area delineated and coloured yellow on said map and marked "Area No. 4";

(Second) To disjoin, in terms of the Registration of Births, Deaths and Marriages (Scotland) Act, 1854, 17 & 18 Vict. c.80, and Acts amending the same, from the Registration District of Cambuslang, that portion of the Civil Parish of Carmunnock proposed to be added to the Royal Burgh of Rutherglen, contained within the beforementioned Area (1), and marked "Area No. 1" on the map produced as relative to the said Petition; and for the purposes of the said Acts

to annex the said portion of Cambuslang Registration District to the Registration District of Rutherglen, and (Third) to fix the First day of January Nineteen hundred and sixty-one as the date on which the said annexation shall come into operation.
