

- (b) As and when the existing headstones or monuments erected on these pre-1940 graves should fall into disrepair the sites will similarly revert to the local authorities for further use.
- (c) Vellum Books or Parchments will be prepared to record the names of all naval personnel buried at North Front Cemetery prior to 1940 ; these will be listed according to religious denominations and will be kept in the appropriate Places of Worship nearby.
- (d) A notice will be displayed in the Cemetery Keeper's office stating that records of old graves are maintained in memorial form in the appropriate Places of Worship.
2. Any person wishing to ascertain details of any naval grave affected (i.e. burial between 1900 and 1939) should communicate with the Secretary of the Admiralty, Queen Anne's Mansions, London S.W.1, quoting NL1897/59.
3. Any person wishing to object to any of the above proposals should write to the Flag Officer, Gibraltar c/o G.P.O., London, before 31st January 1961, stating his reasons.

THE NATIONAL INSURANCE (NON-PARTICIPATION—BENEFITS AND SCHEMES) AMENDMENT (No. 2) REGULATIONS, 1960

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These Regulations amend the National Insurance (Non-participation—Benefits and Schemes) Regulations, 1959, by providing for the recognition for the purposes of the National Insurance Act, 1959, of pension schemes or arrangements established by enactment or other instrument having the force of law in any part of the Commonwealth outside the United Kingdom.
